CHAPTER XXXI.

An Act for creeting a Light-House on the Island of Seguin in the Diffrict of Maine, and for one thing a Beaton and placing three Bucys at the Emrance of Saint Mary's River, in the State of Georgias

DE it charled by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America, in Congress affembled, That it shall be the duty of the Secretary of the Treasury to provide, by contract, which shall be approved by the Prefident of the United States, for building a light-house on the island of Seguin, near the entrance of the river Kennebeck, in the diffrict of Maine, (the of the Pre- commonwealth of Maffachuletts having ceded to the United States ten agres of the faid ifland. for that purpole) and to furnish the same with all necessary supplies, and also to agree for the falaries or wages of the person or persons, who may be appointed by the Prefident, for the superintendance and care of the same: And the Prefident is hereby authorized to make to appoint the faid appointments: That the number or disposition of the light or lights in the faid light-house, be such as may tend to distinguish it from others, as far as is practicable.
